Waminda encourages all clients to make follow up appointments with their Midwife when receiving test results.

Minga Gudjaga - "Mother and Baby"

Minga Gudjaga, meaning "Mother and Baby", offers maternal, child and family health services, as well as sexual and reproductive health services within Waminda.

Minga Gudjaga provides holistic care within a safe and nurturing environment. Our goal is to provide evidence-based care to women and children that is culturally and clinically safe; and to enable women to make informed decisions relating to women's pregnancy, sexual, reproductive and child health, over the continuum of maternity care and for their children up to school age.

Minga Bunaan - "Woman Ceremony"

Aboriginal women within the Birthing on Country program at Waminda have access to cultural practices that help strengthen and affirm their identities as strong Aboriginal women. Minga Bunaan is practised within the Birthing on Country program. For more information, please speak to one of our midwives or Aboriginal Health Practitioners.

Minga Gudjaga Midwifery Practice (MGMP)

We are now able to offer continuity of care via our Midwifery Practice. Each woman will be allocated a primary midwife at the beginning of pregnancy and will receive the majority of care from this same midwife. The midwife will be on call to attend the birth and provide care during labour at Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital (SDMH). The midwife can also provide home visits during pregnancy and once you discharge from hospital until baby is 6 weeks old.

Schedule of Visits

At the beginning of your pregnancy journey, you don't need to see a GP first. Instead, you have the option to get in quicker at Waminda by booking an appointment with an Endorsed Midwife who can request early pregnancy blood tests and ultrasounds. During your pregnancy, you will see a midwife and Aboriginal Health Practitioner (AHP) for the following visits:

- AHP visit each trimester
- Monthly visits up to 28 weeks pregnant
- Fortnightly visits up to 36 weeks pregnant
- Weekly visits up to birth
- Postnatal check-ups as needed up to 6 weeks after birth (including breastfeeding support and baby weighs/checks).

Consult with our Midwives

Consultations with our Midwives and Aboriginal Health Practitioners are available Monday to Friday from 9:00am - 4:30pm.

Walk-in patients are welcome to see one of our midwives or call us to make an appointment.

Transport is available for Waminda services only.

Please call in advance to book.

We will advocate and support clients with a disability to exercise their choice and control over the services they receive while respecting their human and legal rights.

Our organisation provides free and bulk billing services for all women and the Aboriginal families of all ages. Consultations are free to clients who are Medicare card holders. Costs may be involved when accessing referral services, however you will be advised of any out-of-pocket expenses when the referral is being made.

Child and Family Health

Our Child and Family Health Practitioners provide care for your baby from 6 weeks old until 5 years. We use a collaborative approach to personalise family plans and support women through a range of services such as growth and development, feeding and nutrition education, breastfeeding advice, and sleep and settling.
